	There are currently (July 2022) 9 dedicated Neighbourhood Beat Managers (PC's) for the St Austell policing sector supported by 7 PCSOs and 3 Tri-Service Officers.
	The areas of responsibility have been divided into 3 sub-sectors as below, including the number of officers assigned: St Austell Town – including the town centre, Carlyon Bay, Pentewan, Charlestown – 2 x PC's, 2 X PCSO's. St Austell East – including St Blazey, Par, Fowey, Luxulyan and Lostwithiel – 3 x PC's and 3 x PCSO's. St Austell West – including Mevagissey, Grampound, St Stephen, St Dennis, Roche and Bugle – 3 x PC's and 3 x PCSO's.
	The remaining PC has been assigned a Safeguarding role within the neighbourhood team. The Tri Service officers are active in their assigned towns/villages of Lostwithiel, St Dennis and Fowey.
	Response Function
	There are five shifts covering the entire St Austell sector providing 24/7 cover. Each shift is supervised by a patrol sergeant and the resources are directed by radio to attend 'immediate', 'prompt' and 'routine' incidents.
	Supplementary Resources
	St Austell has a contingent from the Special Constabulary who provide a regular service depending on the commitments of their 'day jobs' In addition to supporting Response they are often present during significant events such as Fowey Regatta. St Austell also has a healthy contingent of Police Cadets (aged 13 to 18 years) who also provide a visible presence at local events.
